

## 1 Camp Housing (Aeroplane Hangar)

The sports field is the site of the former camp housing Hailfingen/Tailfingen – in an aeroplane hangar.

GPS: 48°32'47.8"N 8°51'28.5"E (on the west side of the parking lot)

## 2 Information Board 1987

The first information panel was installed without permission. There has been an official panel at the memorial since 2010.

GPS: 48°32'14.0"N 8°51'06.5"E (to the left of the memorial)

## 3 Memorial

A memorial to the 601 concentration camp inmates transported here in 1944. At least 189 of them died here.

GPS: 48°32'13.6"N 8°51'07.4"E (behind the monument)

## 4 Runway

Greenery is taking over from the crumbling runway where night fighters took off and landed towards the end of World War II.

GPS: 48°32'15.1"N 8°51'18.5"E (at the edge of the forest near the first farm)

## 5 Mass Grave

The site where 75 inmates who died in 1945 were buried. Their remains are now interred at the Tailfingen cemetery.

GPS: 48°32'21.3"N 8°52'00.4"E (next to the bush)

## 6 Taxiway

The remains of a road that went from the runway to several hangars. It was built by prisoners.

GPS: 48°32'17.8"N 8°52'01.4"E (the spot where the runway turns to the east)

## 7 Hailfingen Quarry

Hidden behind the bushes is one of four quarries where the prisoners were forced to labour.

GPS: 48°32'06.8"N 8°52'35.9"E (near the road, to the right of the parking lot)

## 8 Hailfingen Cemetery

Three of about 350 to 380 Greek forced labourers at the airfield died. They were buried in Hailfingen.

GPS: 48°31'31.3"N 8°52'05.2"E (in the northern part of the cemetery)

## 9 Columns for Thought (Hangar)

The ruins of a hangar are dedicated to the prisoners-of-war and forced labourers of the Hailfingen airfield.

GPS: 48°32'31.4"N 8°53'38.7"E (the trees next to it can be seen from afar)

## 10 Schäfer Quarry

Prisoners were forced to work at the quarry in Reusten owned by the Schäfer company. A hand cart is a reminder of their hard labour.

GPS: 48°32'26.3"N 8°55'35.5"E (exiting the village towards Poltringen)

## 11 Tailfingen Cemetery

The 75 concentration camp inmates who were found in a mass grave in June 1945 are interred here in a collective grave.

GPS: 48°33'11.5"N 8°52'48.0"E (in the southeast section of the cemetery)

## 12 Documentation Centre

Inside the old Tailfingen town hall is a multi-media permanent exhibition and a seminar room used for educational purposes.

GPS: 48°33'05.6"N 8°52'31.3"E (back entrance, Hauptstr. 39, 71126 Gäufelden)
